<u>UBC Flexible Learning</u> was initiated in 2013 to integrate technology effectively across classrooms, enhancing teaching practices and promoting active learning. As the primary contact and liaison between the Sauder School of Business and CTLT, I provide strategic planning and support for various teaching and learning projects, ensuring resources and services align with UBC's strategic priorities.

- Institutional Priorities Advocacy: I provide consultations on Open Educational Resources (OER), University Design for Learning (UDL), Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI), Artificial Intelligence (AI), Academic Integrity, Experiential Learning, Indigenous Engagement, Sustainability, Personalized Learning, Learning Analytics, and Student Experience. I engage in roles such as co-applicant, project manager, project mentor, learning designer, resource provider to advance UBC and Sauder's strategic priorities.
  - o I was involved in UBC UDL Fellows Program as a Fellow in 2023 and as a planning team member in 2024 that focused on flexible and inclusive learning environment.
  - O The Animated Accounting project team developed Open Education materials/resources through UBC OER grant (\$25,000) for student affordability and this project enabled the students enrolled in COMM293 Financial Accounting course in 2023W and onward to save \$130 (a total annual savings of \$130,000 considering the enrollment of 700-800 students annually) by utilizing the OER and removing the mandatory textbook.
  - Ch'nook Indigenous Management Program was one of the Dean's priorities at Sauder. I provided concierge service to the program for the LTI integration for the delivery of the program.
  - O The Large Teaching, Learning Enhancement (TLEF) Transformation Project (three-year project from 2024-2026) aims to integrate SDG-related content into the business curriculum to develop future responsible leaders. I serve as the co-applicant for the proposal development and the project manager/mentor for the development and evaluation of the project by working with the project team (instructors and students)

- Project management for program/course development: Plan and facilitate
  educational initiatives from start to completion ensuring projects are completed on
  time and within budget.
  - O I led Flexible Learning projects for the Commerce Minor Flexible Program in the Sauder School of Business by developing six Flexible Learning courses (blended learning) and supporting instructors for teaching excellence through collaboration with CTLT and stakeholders across the university (2014-2018). I took the leadership to initiate Flex designation for the first time within UBC and added additional notes for these flexible learning courses (flexibility in time and space) in UBC student enrollment services so that right students could take the right modality of the courses.
  - O As project manager and learning designer, I developed and supported Sauder Business School's Family Business MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) and edX MicroMasters Business Fundamentals program (6 courses), which evolved into a Professional Certificate Program (UBCx). The Introduction to Marketing course was a top 5 course in terms of student enrollment in the courses using edX platform.
- Assessment and Academic Integrity: Learning Services at Sauder I am currently embedded within Sauder has supported approximately 116,936 online exams for midterm and final exams since 2010. The team collaborates with Faculty for the plans, designs, and implementation of online exams and leads the coordination, logistics and overall supervision of the online exams. I occasionally proctor exams when my team needs additional help. Academic Integrity is a fundamental part of a student's experience in university and academia. UBC provides extensive resources for the teaching and learning community.
  - O During COVID-19, CTLT developed CTLT's Online Teaching Program (Faculty training program) to help Faculty adapt their course for the online environment and prepare to teach online. As universities moved online in the COVID-19 crisis, many institutions reported increases in academic misconduct. This program includes content on designing online assessments and ways to increase academic integrity in online assessments. I was part of the project team who authored the module contents.
  - As an instructor teaching online courses, I am particularly interested in assessment within the online environment. I believe that fostering a culture of academic integrity through education, rather than simply penalizing students for misconduct, is essential. I share these views when consulting with faculty and designing programs or courses as well as through presentations (MET UBC TechTalk-Assessment Methods, July 21, 2021).

- **Innovation:** Observe innovation, draw from theory, practice, and research, and identify suitable opportunities that may enhance learning in Sauder.
  - To respond to the emergent situation (Covid-19), I supported UBC Sauder's International MBA (IMBA) program as the project leader on behalf of the Learning Services team (for technology, project management, and learning design support) at Sauder from 2020 to 2023. The IMBA program is based in Shanghai Jiao Tong University, UBC Sauder's partner institution, where classes are typically held. Before Covid-19, UBC instructors travelled to Shanghai, delivering intensive weekend classes in person. The expensive IMBA program, which costs nearly USD \$75,000 per student, was the first program significantly impacted when Shanghai Jiao Tong University closed in February 2020. We had to ensure that students in Shanghai received a classroom experience comparable to in-person learning. Our innovative solution involved using our studio, where instructors delivered their live classes and recorded videos using lightboard and green screen studio with support of onsite studio staff. All of the instructor's materials were captured via doc cams, laptops, iPads, etc. and routed through USB video capture into the studio computer where everything was compiled into the live broadcasting software (Wirecast). According to the survey the program office administered, students had a positive learning experience with this innovative approach.
- Partnership services/Relationship builder and connector: Establish and main
  relationships with Sauder support organizations, academic service areas and
  technology providers to facilitate knowledge-transfer, develop best practice and foster
  community-building. I connect faculty members to the right resources, link support
  staff with one another to enhance the student learning experience and to build
  capacity for teaching and learning projects.
  - Sauder implemented Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS) in 2015 to support Sauder students taking two historically challenging courses (COMM290 and 291). Beyond the anecdotal success of the program, I took the initiative to formally evaluate PASS and assess student needs. Collaboratting with the PASS team and Canacoord Learning Commons (CLC) librarians, we explored factors that influenced students' motivation to participate and their satisfaction with the program. The investigation was conducted through the 2018 Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) Seed Research Grant.

    According to the results of the investigation, there was a significant desire from students to see PASS offered for other challenging courses. In response, the PASS program has now been redesigned and expanded and offered to multiple courses (COMM 290, 291, 293, 298, and 320).
